

TERMS AND CONDITION OF EALTA MEMBERSHIP (CURRENTLY IN FORCE, REVISED 27.11.2013)

- 1. Individual Membership is open to all those individuals working or living in Member States of the European Union or the Council of Europe with an interest and preferably an involvement in language testing and/or assessment. Those not eligible for Individual Membership may apply to become Associate Members.
 - Countries conferring eligibility are currently: Albania, Andorra, Armenia, Austria, Azerbaijan, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Moldova, Monaco, Montenegro, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Russian Federation, San Marino, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, 'The former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia', Turkey, Ukraine, United Kingdom (status 2013)
- 2. Individual Membership in EALTA is free, as is Associate Membership. Periodically, Members may be asked to confirm that they wish to continue their Membership. If applicable, they may also be asked to accept revised Terms and Conditions of Membership. A Member who fails to confirm continuation and acceptance of the Terms and Conditions will be deemed to have resigned.
- 3. Only Individual and Associate Members present at the Annual General Meeting have the right to vote. Votes can only be cast *in presentia*.
- 4. Associate Members do not have the right to be Members of the Executive Committee.
- 5. By becoming Individual or Associate Member of EALTA a person consents to EALTA to hold personal details supplied to EALTA in the joining process. Consent is also given for EALTA to contact the Member periodically with information. Subscription to the EALTA e-mail discussion list is optional. Data held about Members will not be given by EALTA to any person or institution outside EALTA's Membership. Members' names and contact details may be passed to other Members and Member Institutions where this is in pursuit of the stated aims of EALTA.

- 6. Members must not use the EALTA name, acronym or logo in such a way as to suggest that they represent or are speaking on behalf of the organisation without the expressed permission of an EALTA officer.
- 7. A Member may leave the organisation at any time by writing to EALTA at the address given in the 'Contacts' page of the EALTA website.
- 8. The EALTA Membership Committee reserves the right to refuse or terminate Membership without giving reasons. A Member may, within a month, appeal against the decision to the President of EALTA. The Executive Committee will consider the case and the evidence submitted to support the appeal and its decision will be final.
